Each year we sponsor a special award in both the Junior and Senior divisions for best use of the year's topic (this year it's "Innovation in History"), pertaining to the American West in the period from 1850-1900 +/- a few years, in a performance. We have seen some very creative performances in past years and are very proud to be one of the sponsors of this fine program. State Finals will be Saturday May 1st at Bellevue Community College, 3000 Landerholm Circle SE, Bellevue WA 98007. The awards ceremony begins usually about 6:30pm, but come early & see some of the competitions & exhibits.....doors open at 7:30 am.

National History Day is a program, now in it's 26th year, that encourages the study of History and assists teachers in development of curriculum. A topic of the year is decided, then students can either write a paper, create an exhibit, do a performance, or make a documentery video. The students then compete in the Junior (middle school) or Senior (high school) divisions on an in state regional level, progressing to the state finals, then on to the nationals in College Park MD. The students are not limited to any particular period of History for their projects. Doc Maynard chose the American West 1850-1900 as a criteria for our award due to that being the location & time period of ECV's

heyday, and performance because, well, we're a performance kinda group. We <u>strongly</u> encourage any Chapter, Outpost, AND Grand Council to look into getting involved in National History Day in their area
